

## NEW TESTAMENT CITATIONS OF OLD TESTAMENT PROPHECIES

OT Prophecy		NT Reference
In that day the root of Jesse, who shall stand as a signal for the peoples-- of him shall the nations inquire, and his resting place shall be glorious. <b>Isaiah 11:10</b>	Root of Jesse, hope of the nations	And again Isaiah says, "The root of Jesse will come, even he who arises to rule the Gentiles; in him will the Gentiles hope" <b>Romans 15:12</b>
I will send my messenger, who will prepare the way before me. Then suddenly the Lord you are seeking will come to his temple; the messenger of the covenant, whom you desire, will come," says the LORD Almighty. <b>Malachi 3:1</b>	John the Baptist foretold	"This is the one about whom it is written: " I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you.' "I tell you among those born of women there is no one greater than John; yet the one who is least in the kingdom of God is greater than he." <b>Luke 7:27-28</b>
Surely he took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows, yet we considered him stricken by God, smitten by him, and afflicted. <b>Isaiah 53:4</b>	Miraculous Healings foretold and fulfilled	When evening came, many who were demon-possessed were brought to him, and he drove out the spirits with a word and healed all the sick. This was to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet Isaiah: "He took up our infirmities and carried our diseases." <b>Matthew 8:16,17</b>
The Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is on me, because the LORD has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners, to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor and the day of vengeance of our God, to comfort all who mourn... <b>Isaiah 61:1,2</b>	Foretold Proclaimer of Good News revealed through Jesus' Self-Proclamation	He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. Unrolling it, he found the place where it is written: " <b>The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor.</b> " Then he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant and sat down. The eyes of everyone in the synagogue were fastened on him. He began by saying to them, " <b>Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing.</b> " <b>Luke 4:17-21</b>
He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he opened not his mouth. <b>Isaiah 53:7</b>	Dumb before accusers	<sup>12</sup> But when he was accused by the chief priests and elders, he gave no answer. <sup>13</sup> Then Pilate said to him, "Do you not hear how many things they testify against you?" <sup>14</sup> But he gave him no answer, not even to a single charge, so that the governor was greatly amazed. <b>Matthew 27:12-14</b>
<sup>16</sup> And David said to him ( <i>the slain Amalekite who slew Saul</i> ), "Your blood be upon your head; for your own mouth has testified against you, saying, 'I have slain the Lord's anointed.'...Thy glory, O Israel, is slain upon thy high places! How are the mighty fallen!" <b>2 Samuel 1:16,19 64</b>	Torture and Slaying of the Anointed	<sup>27</sup> The people of Jerusalem and their rulers did not recognize Jesus, yet in condemning him they fulfilled the words of the prophets that are read every Sabbath. <sup>28</sup> Though they found no proper ground for a death sentence, they asked Pilate to have him executed. <sup>29</sup> When they had carried out all that was written about him, they took him down from the cross and laid him in a tomb. <b>Acts 13:27-29</b>
They also blindfolded him and kept asking him, "Prophecy! Who is it that struck you?" <b>Luke 22:64</b>		
They part My garments among them, and cast lots upon My vesture. <b>Psalms 22:18</b>		
He was assigned a grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death, though he had done no violence, nor was any deceit in his mouth. <b>Isaiah 53:9</b>	Sinless Savior	To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his footsteps. "He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth." <b>1 Peter 2:21,22</b>

<p>For dogs encompass me; a company of evildoers encircles me; they have pierced my hands and feet. <b>Psalm 22:16</b></p>	<p>Hands and Feet pierced</p>	<p>And when they came to the place that is called The Skull, there they crucified him...<b>Luke 23:33</b></p>
<p>Therefore I will divide him a portion with the many, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong, because he poured out his soul to death and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and makes intercession for the transgressors. <b>Isaiah 53:12</b></p>	<p>Crucified with thieves</p>	<p>Then two robbers were crucified with him, one on the right and one on the left. <b>Matthew 27:38</b></p>
<p>And I took the thirty pieces of silver, and cast them to the potter in the house of the Lord. <b>Zechariah 11:13b</b></p>	<p>Money to be thrown in God's house/Price given for Potter's field</p>	<p>And he cast down the pieces of silver in the temple, and departed...<b>Matthew 27:5a</b></p>
<p>I have set the Lord always before me. Because he is at my right hand, I will not be shaken. Therefore my heart is glad and my tongue rejoices; my body also will rest secure, because you will not abandon me to the grave, nor will you let your Holy One see decay. You have made known to me the path of life, you will fill me with joy in your presence, with eternal pleasures at your right hand. <b>Psalm 16:8-11</b></p>	<p>Savior Resurrected From The Grave</p>	<p>"But God raised him from the dead, freeing him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him. David said about him: 'I saw the Lord always before me. Because he is at my right hand, I will not be shaken. Therefore my heart is glad and my tongue rejoices; my body also will live in hope, because you will not abandon me to the grave, nor will you let your Holy One see decay. You have made known to me the paths of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence.' Brothers, I can tell you confidently that the patriarch David died and was buried and his tomb is here to this day. But he was a prophet and knew that God had promised him on oath that he would place one of his descendants on his throne. Seeing what was ahead, he spoke of the resurrection of the Christ, that he was not abandoned to the grave, nor did his body see decay. God has raised this Jesus to life, and we are all witnesses of the fact." <b>Acts 2:24-32</b></p>
<p>Surely he took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows, yet we considered him stricken by God, smitten by him, and afflicted. But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed. We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; he was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth...After the suffering of his soul, he will see the light of life, and be satisfied; by his knowledge my righteous servant will justify many and he will bear their iniquities. <b>Isaiah 53:4-7, 11</b></p>	<p>Peter proclaims the Suffering Servant</p>	<p>When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly. He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. For you were like sheep going astray, but now you have returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls. <b>1 Peter 2:23-25</b></p>
<p>Then God said, "<b>Let there be light</b>"; and there was light. And God saw the light, that it was good; and <i>God divided the light from the darkness.</i> <b>Genesis 1:3,4</b> Then God said, "Let there be lights in the firmament of the heavens to divide the day from the night...God set them in the firmament of the heavens to give light on the earth, and to rule over the day and over the night, and to <i>divide the light from the darkness.</i> <b>Genesis 1:14, 17</b></p>	<p>Light Shines In The Darkness</p>	<p>"I am saying nothing beyond what the prophets and Moses said would happen--that the Christ would suffer and, as the first to rise from the dead, would proclaim light to his own people and to the Gentiles." <b>Acts 26:22-23</b> For we do not preach ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, and ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake. For God, who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," made his light shine in our hearts to give us the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Christ. <b>2 Corinthians 4:5,6</b></p>
<p>...so will he sprinkle many nations, and kings will shut their mouths because of him. For what they were not told, they will see, and what they have not heard, they will understand. <b>Isaiah 52:15</b></p>	<p>Gentile nations will see and understand the gospel of Christ</p>	<p>It has always been my ambition to preach the gospel where Christ was not known, so that I would not be building on someone else's foundation. Rather, it is written: "Those who were not told about him will see, and those who have not heard will understand." <b>Romans 15:20</b></p>

<p>After the suffering of his soul, he will see the light of life, and be satisfied; by his knowledge my righteous servant will justify many, and he will bear their iniquities. <b>Isaiah 53:11</b></p>	<p><b>Forgiveness Of Sins Through The Suffering Savior</b></p>	<p>All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name. <b>Acts 10:43</b></p>	
<p>Who has believed our message and to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed? <b>Isaiah 53:1</b></p>	<p>Who would believe the report of Jesus, the suffering servant, crucified for sin?</p>	<p>But not all the Israelites believed the good news. For Isaiah says, "Lord who has believed our message?" Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ. <b>Romans 10:16-17</b></p>	
<p>He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; he was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth. <b>Isaiah 53:7,8</b></p>	<p>The Eunuch believes in the Suffering Servant Savior Jesus proclaimed by Philip</p>	<p>The eunuch was reading this passage of scripture: "He was led like a sheep to the slaughter, and as a lamb before the shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth. In his humiliation he was deprived of justice. Who can speak of his descendants? For his life was taken from the earth." The eunuch asked Philip, "tell me, please, who is the prophet talking about, himself, or someone else?" Then Philip began with that very passage of Scripture and told him the good news about Jesus. <b>Acts 8:32-35</b></p>	
<p>I will proclaim the Lord's decree: He said to me, "You are my son; today I have become your father." <b>Psalms 2:7</b></p>	<p>King David decayed in the grave, King Jesus was raised from the dead without decay.</p>	<p>32 "We tell you the good news: What God promised our ancestors 33 he has fulfilled for us, their children, by raising up Jesus. As it is written in the second Psalm:</p> <p>"You are my son; today I have become your father."</p> <p>34 God raised him from the dead so that he will never be subject to decay." As God has said,</p> <p>"I will give you the holy and sure blessings promised to David."</p> <p>35 So it is also stated elsewhere:</p> <p>"You will not let your holy one see decay."</p> <p>36 "Now when David had served God's purpose in his own generation, he fell asleep; he was buried with his ancestors and his body decayed. 37 But the one whom God raised from the dead did not see decay. <b>Acts 13:32-37</b></p>	
<p>Give ear and come to me; listen, that you may live. I will make an everlasting covenant with you, my faithful love promised to David. <b>Isaiah 55:3</b></p>			
<p>..because you will not abandon me to the realm of the dead, nor will you let your faithful one see decay. <b>Psalms 16:10</b></p>			
<p>Sacrifice and offering you did not desire-but my ears you have opened-burnt offerings and sin offerings you did not require. Then I said, "Here I am, I have come-it is written about me in the scroll. I desire to do your will, my God; your law is within my heart." <b>Psalms 40:6-8</b></p>	<p>Jesus, the sufficient sacrifice</p>	<p>Therefore, when Christ came into the world, he said: "Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but a body you prepared for me; with burnt offerings and sin offerings you were not pleased. Then I said, 'Here I am-It is written about me in the scroll-I have come to do your will, my God.' "...And by that will, we have been made holy through the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ once for all. <b>Hebrews 10:5-7,10</b></p>	
<p>Now to him who is able to establish you in accordance with my gospel, the message I proclaim about Jesus Christ, in keeping with the revelation of the mystery hidden for long ages past, but now revealed and made known through the prophetic writings by the command of the eternal God, so that all the Gentiles might come to the obedience that comes from faith--to the only wise God be glory forever through Jesus Christ!
